
SHAFTESBURY TOWN TWINNING ASSOCIATION

All in all it was a very memorable occasion for them." "Some thoughts from the weekend. I felt really well entertained and looked after during my time on the twinning trip. From the Max Ernst Museum through a cruise on the Rhine to sea shanties to round off the weekend. With regard to the present. My father, Jack Hayward, made the little blue cart from a plan and he cut all the pieces of timber himself. The gypsy wagon was made by my husband, Graham, and that too came from a plan and all pieces were individually cut out including the wheels. It really was a labour of love for both of them.
