Lindlar Visit 2019, 2nd to 6th May - Twenty one members boarded the coach at 7am on Thursday and travelled via the channel Tunnel, arriving in Lindlar at 8:30pm local time. We were warmly welcomed by our hosts as always and enjoyed the comfort of their homes for the first evening.



University Hospital at Aachen

On Friday, We visited Aachen by coach where a local guide boarded and we toured the outskirts of the City. Aachen is situated directly on the border with Belgium and the Netherlands. It is Germany's most westerly city, with a population of 250,000.

More than 50,000 students attend Aachen's four major colleges and universities (Rhineland-Westphalian Technical University [RWTH], University of Applied Sciences, Catholic University of Applied Sciences and Academy of Music.

We then enjoyed a guided tour of the Old City, Cathedral, Town Hall, Shops and Streets, finally stopping for lunch at the "Goldener Schwann".

Charlemagne has left his mark throughout the city. The cathedral - the first monument in Germany to be included in the UNESCO Cultural Heritage list - and the gothic City Hall in which 32 German kings celebrated their coronations still form the heart of Aachen's old city centre.





After lunch we visited the Lindt factory shop. Most of the party succumbed to the temptation came away with a bag or two.

Friday evening and Saturday was spent with our hosts. Visits were varied and included Cologne, Schloss Augustusburg at Bruhl, Bergische Gladbach, Lindlar, Villa Huegel, near Essen and a ride on the 0-Bahn, the world's first guided bus way.

On Saturday evening, we again spent time with our hosts and many of us found our way to the local craft brewery to witness the tapping of The Maibock (7%) Beer and the local band from Linde. We made every effort to represent the Twinning Group at the bar and were pleased to be able to support the local economy......



Sunday, after a leisurely breakfast we made a brief visit to see the climbing wall, an innovative use of a redundant factory with a hall of climbing boulders and a hall of climbing walls. In the afternoon, many of us headed off into the scenic countryside for a 90 minute walk. We met back at a local restaurant for a three course Dinner where we were welcomed by Dr. Georg Ludwig – Bürgermeister für Lindlar. After the short speeches we returned to our host's homes for the rest of the evening.
